“The Eucharistic Miracles of the World”

Where: St. John the Baptist Social Hall

When: May 10th (5:30-8:30), 11th (12-8:30), & 12th (11:30-4)

Most Eucharistic miracles involve incidences in which the Host has "turned into human flesh and blood". **Catholics believe that the consecrated Host is the real presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord**, under the appearance of bread and wine. Therefore, through these miracles, Jesus merely manifests His Presence in a more tangible way.

Carlo Acutis wanted to make the Miracles of the Eucharist Exhibit available to help other people strengthen their faith. He died from fulminant leukaemia at the age of 15. Upon receiving First Holy Communion at age 7, he never missed daily Mass.

Carlo placed the Sacrament of the Eucharist at the heart of his own life. He always tried to practice Eucharist Devotion and was convinced that “by standing before the Eucharistic Christ, we become holy”. He also said “Christ is present the same way he was present 2000 years ago in the time of the Apostles.” “Jerusalem is right on our doorstep”.

The exhibit contains 126 miracles approved by Bishops of the Catholic Church and are on 140 exhibit panels including 17 maps showing where the miracles occurred in 20 countries. Most of the churches at the sites of the miracles are Eucharistic sanctuaries or shrines honoring the miracle. A “Children’s Corner” with crafts/materials will be available as well as media/books for sale.
