Dear Father Sedlak and the Parish Family of Saint Joseph Church,

I am writing to you today after pondering your noble history of living out your vocation as the People of God in the Parish of Saint Joseph in Everson, Pennsylvania. In preparation for the grand celebration of your 125 year anniversary on September 9, 2012, I encourage all parishioners to become reacquainted with the significant people and events of your long and faithful pilgrimage of faith. By reflecting on the past, we are able not only to know where we have been but will understand a bit more clearly where we must go.

Your parish is aptly named for the Patron of the Church, Saint Joseph. The primary task of Saint Joseph was to form a family of faith, hope and love. We call Joseph's family the Holy Family, which consisted of Jesus, Mary and himself. But his family would extend far beyond that. Today Saint Joseph is called the Patron of the Universal Church. He not only formed a nuclear family, he helped form a people, the People of God. And it has been that sense of family and community that has been the hallmark of the Catholic Church and of your individual Catholic parish over these many years. When families are strong, so is the faith. So is love. So is our hope for the future.

When Father Alexander Szmigiel helped found your parish in 1887, undoubtedly, he understood that he had to establish a family of faith, to form a people. One of his first actions was to address the needs of the family, so he formed a Catholic school in 1889, and in just a decade the school's enrollment reached 600 children. The Saint Joseph School, especially identified with the Sisters of the Holy Ghost, would help educate and form in the faith a century of Catholic children.

Perhaps because of this citadel of Christian learning in your midst, many vocations to priesthood and religious life were nourished. I am left in wonder at this indisputable fact that three parishes in the Diocese of Greensburg named after Saint Joseph in Uniontown, New Kensington and Everson have produced an uncommon number of vocations over the years for service in the Church.

Beyond the former Catholic school, Saint Joseph Parish's history enjoys a proud legacy of identifying itself with its Polish roots as well as with the community of Everson. These two relationships have been pillars of strength for the identity of Saint Joseph Church in upholding traditions of ethnicity and faith, and assisted the parish in focusing on service in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy to people in need throughout the community.

I applaud you and your ancestors of faith whose living out of the Christian life stands as a true witness to Christ's presence on every page of your history. May we, the Diocese of Greensburg and Saint Joseph Parish of Everson, continue to be partners in that lived faith once delivered to your forbearers and now passed on to us for our sharing through evangelization and faith witness.

# SAINT JOSEPH PARISH 1887-2012

From the very humble beginnings, Saint Joseph Roman Catholic Church, Everson, has grown to a parish of approximately 350 families. Now in its 125th year, St Joseph remains rich in the tradition that began August 21, 1887 with the first mass, celebrated by a young priest by the name of Fr Alexander W Szmigiel. The parish was then officially established on September 15th.

From the church's inception, Bishop Phelan of the Pittsburgh Diocese appointed Fr Szmigiel, a newly ordained priest, as St. Joseph's first pastor. Fr Szmigiel had served as an assistant at St. John the Baptist parish in Scottdale just prior to his appointment. Fr Szmigiel was educated in Poland, in Rome, and at the seminary in Lovain in Belgium. He completed his studies for the priesthood in Beatty (now Latrobe), Pennsylvania and was ordained at Saint Vincent's Seminary. He served at St Joseph's for 14 years until he died in 1901 at the age of 39. The young Polish priest is recognized as the founding father of St Joseph Roman Catholic Church.

Saint Joseph Church has the distinction of being the oldest Polish parish in the Diocese of Greensburg and the third oldest in Western Pennsylvania. A Polish church had been the goal of the many Polish people who had come to settle along Jacob's Creek an earn their livelihood in the 1800's. These people lived a rather solitary life at first, not organized to any ethnic affiliation and not understanding nor being understood at the English-speaking parish they had to attend. Slowly, however, these Poles began to get acquainted, and they organized various lodges and societies, the first under the patronage of St. Joseph. With the thought of starting their own church, these groups purchased several lots and a wooden building in the area of Vance and Painter Streets in Everson where today stands St Joseph's Church.

The parish plant currently consists of the Church, former School, former convent, and rectory. However things were not always so prosperous. The first church was the 40X20 wooden frame structure purchased in

1887 to satisfy the needs of the non-English speaking Polish families. Originally known as Major Knapp's Episcopalian Chapel, it also served as Saint John the Baptist Roman Catholic Church until 1882 when St. John's Congregation purchased property in Scottdale.

Less then a month after the parish of Saint Joseph celebrated its first mass in that little church, Thomas Stachowiak had the honor of being the first person baptized. This historic event took place on September 11, 1887. The next day, Michael Baran and Elizabeth Behrin became the first couple united in the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony at St. Joseph's.

After just one year, the small church building was becoming increasingly inadequate for a parish that had grown from 87 families to include over a hundred families. The church was then converted to a parish school and a larger wooden church was built. Soon other Slavic nationalities, in addition to the Polish people of Everson, began attending St Joseph's and the second church, like the first one, became too small. While some of the people went on to attend new churches in the surrounding communities of Uniontown, Connellsville, Mount Pleasant, Mammoth, and Footdale, St. Joseph's still needed a larger church.

In 1892, five years after its founding, St. Joseph's received the good news that a new and larger church was to be built. At a cost of \$8000, the red brick building, which presently serves the parish was erected. The cornerstone was laid on July 31, 1892 by the Rt. Rev R. Phelan., D.D., Bishop of Pittsburgh. The church was dedicated on May 14, 1893 by the Very Rev. Regis Canevin, subsequently named Bishop of the Pittsburgh Diocese.

The new church, built in the Gothic style similar to those in Poland, was constructed in the shape of a cross 112 feet long and 44 feet wide. The original steeple reached 156 feet into the sky, but after being damaged by lightening, it was dismantled and reduced to the present 115 foot high steeple.

The building that had served for four years as the church was converted into a four-classroom school.

From 1888, the parish school had been staffed by lay teachers. Then in 1898, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth assumed charge until 1920. From 1920 until the closure of the school in 1990 the Sisters of the Holy Spirit formerly the Sisters of the Holy Ghost) had been teaching at the school.

A convent for the sister had been built in 1897. The first rectory for the pastor was built in 1889, was damaged by fire on May 17, 1921; it was rebuilt the same year. And, in 1924 the present brick school was built.

The church itself has undergone two major renovations: the first in 1937 in celebration of the 50th jubilee and the second in 1969. The most notable change in the appearance of the church came with second renovation. At that time, the sanctuary was renovated to allow the altar to face the congregation and to meet other requirements necessitated by the liturgical

reforms of The Second Vatican Council; other extensive work was done to the church interior and to the exterior as well.

For the 100th anniversary several projects were undertaken to improve both the interior and exterior of the church. In the past 25 years St. Joseph's has continued to improve and preserve our beautiful church. The church masonry has been repaired and pointed. New efficient furnaces were installed in the church. The church roof was replaced in 2011.

Projects currently underway during this 125th anniversary year include: a walkway above the ceiling, complete interior patching and painting, and installation of an air conditioning system. None of these projects would be possible without the generous parishioners of St Joseph Parish.

St. Joseph's held its 38th annual summer festival in July 2012.

### SAINT JOSEPH'S SCHOOL

Saint Joseph's School started in 1888, one year after the parish formed. From 1888-1898 the school was staffed by lay teachers. Then in 1898, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth assumed charge until 1920. In 1924 the current 3 story school was built. From 1920 until the closure of the school in 1990 the Sisters of the Holy Spirit(formerly the Sisters of the Holy Ghost) had been teaching at the school. Many children attended Saint Joseph's School and were given a quality Catholic education. Today the school building continues to be used for Children's Religious education classes, Parish social functions, and Parish meetings.


# Sisters who have served St. Joseph Parish

Father Alexander Szmigiel, the founding father of St. Joseph Church, was born in Pialkourzna, Poland on May 3, 1862. He attended the Holy Ghost Seminary in Warsaw. He received a Doctor of Philosophy degree from St. Peters College and in 1885 he was sent to the Diocese of Pittsburgh.

Father Szmigiel was ordained on July 17, 1887 at St. Vincent Seminary in Beatty, Pa, now Latrobe, by Bishop Phelan. He was the first Polish priest ordained for the Diocese of Greensburg. After his ordination he was sent to Scottdale and soon founded the St. Joseph Parish in Everson for the Polish people. He remained at St. Joseph until his death fourteen years later at the age of 39. During his pastorship he built the church, rectory, school and convent. In the years he served as the parish priest the attachment between he and the church grew so deep that he requested to be buried within the church basement. Later, in 1938, his body was relocated to a new grave. His remains were transferred to our church cemetery by order of Bishop Connare in 1973.

Blessed Pope John Paul II, born Karol Jozef Wojlyla, was born on May 18, 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. He reigned as Pope of the Catholic Church from 1978 until his death in

2005. Pope Paul II was acclaimed as one of the most influential leaders of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. He was instrumental in ending communism in Poland and eventually all of Europe. A key goal of his papacy was to transform and reposition the Catholic Church. His wish was "to place his Church at the heart of a new religious alliance that would bring together Jews, Muslims, and Christians in a great religious armad." John Paul was proclaimed venerable by Pope Benedict XVI and was beautified on May 1, 2011.

Father Justin Figas was baptized Michael in 1886, attended St. Joseph Parish and school. In 1900, he departed to study for the priesthood and was ordained a conventual Franciscan

in 1910. Fr. Justin served as a curate, later provential superior and organized the "Godzina ozancowa ojca Justyna" or the Father Justin Rosary Hour in 1931. It continued as the longest weekly religious radios program in the Polish language both in Canada and in the USA.
